**Benedict, Marie; Carnegie's Maid:** Clara Kelley, just off the boat from Ireland, misrepresents herself as a vanished Clara Kelley, lady's maid, to the Andrew Carnegie household. This is a tale of how Clara, who keeps us the ruse of who she is, spurs Andrew Carnegie's transformation from a callous industrialist to a world class philanthropist.

**Benjamin, Chloe; The Immortalist:** If you were told the date of your death, how would it shape your present? It's 1969 in New York City, and four adolescent children decide to have a psychic tell them their future. It is an intriguing testament to the power of story, the nature of belief, and the unrelenting pull of familial bonds.

**Benjamin, Melanie; The Girls in the Picture:** It is 1914, and two woman with different passions cross paths. Frances Marion has come to LA to write stories for the silent movies. Actress, Mary Pickford, is "America's Sweetheart" of movies. They form a kinship working to create and to move audiences to a frenzy, to start a revolution. Their ambitions are challenged.
